Arogunjo said this in an interview with **UNIMED titbits** following the commencement of the 2015/2016 Second semester examination, which ended on Tuesday. Arogunjo, who is also the Chairman of the Curriculum and Examination Committee of UNIMED, said, "Examination as a single test of knowledge should be devoid of irregularities and since the inception of the University, no student of the institution has been involved in cheating during examination. "The Vice-Chancellor, Prof. Friday Okonofua is highly passionate about the integrity of the examination of this University, and he has put everything in place to make sure that examinations are properly conducted."

NABTEB seeks more recognition

A team from the board, led by Mr Emmanuel Omoniyi made this known during a visit to the Vice Chancellor of the University of Medical Sciences, Ondo, Prof. Friday Okonofua.

He said the visit was part of the awareness programme on behalf of the board to sensitise the public about NABTEB.

“ It is unfortunate today that people don’t know much about NABTEB, which is an examination body that has existed for many years. We conduct exams for

technical,business and general education candidates, most especially for admission purposes,” Omoniyi said.

The Vice Chancellor, UNIMED, Prof. Friday Okonofua said he appreciated the visit.

He however tasked the team to come up with necessary documents on the mode of operation of NABTEB, so that the University can decide needed policy on the matter.

“There is no way we

can capture this in our policy unless we hear from you officially. If we have such document and we want to take any action, then we can always refer to it or to you as appropriate if we need more clarification”, the VC said.

Complete E-Learning System for UNIMED by 2018---VC

The Vice Chancellor, University of Medical Sciences, Ondo, Prof. Friday Okonofua has said that one of the strategic plans of the University is to provide complete e-learning management system platform for teaching and research by 2018.

He made this known during the opening session of Google Digital Learning Initiative's one-day training programme for students and staff of the University on Information Technology.

The VC, who was represented by the Dean of Student Affairs, UNIMED, Dr (Mrs) Yemisi Jeff-Agboola, said, *"The University is embarking on deployment of virtual learning technologies for teaching all courses in the University, UNIMED courseware repository, e-library Management System and video conferencing infrastructure. "The University is developing a strong Information and Communication Technology backbone needed to enhance quality education for students and give administrators and faculty the means to operate effectively and efficiently."*

He congratulated the students who are pioneer beneficiaries of the Google Digital Learning Initiative and promised that the institution would give adequate attention to training and re-training of staff and students in ICT related topics.

In his welcome address, the Director, Information and Communication Technology, Mr. Ebenezer Olajuyigbe identified Information Technology as 'the hub of all career', hence the need for training in digital marketing skill. He said, *"The goals of the Google Initiative include ensuring that every student has exposure to latest technology tools to be globally competitive, transforming teaching and learning in the classroom, ensuring equitable access to digital tools and resources for blended opportunities, and closing digital divide regardless of student's background, geographical area, or socio-economic status."* The Google Digital Training for Youth Empowerment was initially flagged-off by the

Vice President of Nigeria, Prof. Yemi Osinbajo and 400,000 youths are expected to benefit from the programme.

The training was conducted by Swifta, an IT training based company in partnership with Google for Education in Nigeria.
