HEI 814: Research methodology (three-credit units). This course covers definition and purpose of research, types of research, special cases in medical entrepreneurship and innovation management. Research Process: Problem identification, formulating research questions, objective and hypotheses, conceptual clarification, study variable and models, research plan; literature review; Research design and philosophy, methods of gathering data: types of data, sources of data, research population, sample and sample size, sampling procedure and methods: questionnaire design, pilot testing, validity and reliability tests; statistical packages and applications; research reporting and writing; ethical considerations; referencing types and application

HEI 891: Leadership and management (two-credit units). This course consists of definition of Leadership, concept of Leadership Style, common Leadership styles, characteristics and dimensions of servant leadership; Team working; communication skills, Negotiation: objective and Focus points of negotiation, position and interest, principles of Negotiation;

Factors influencing negotiations and their outcomes, Pre-negotiation Considerations, Stages of Negotiation, review of case studies. Leadership qualities. Developing leadership skills. Conflict in organizations. Handling conflict. conflicting management. Principles and importance of corporate governance.

HEI 826: Management information system (three-credit units). The course comprises the definition of Management Information System (MIS); role of MIS in an organization, elements of a system, types and major classifications of system, concept and component of an information system. Overview of data processing; definition, important, types, stages and future of data processing, Systems Development Life Cycle phases, System analysis and design; Types of design, strategies, Structured Analysis tool and techniques, system analyst skills, methods of file organization, categories of information related to managerial levels and the decision managers make, Methods of implementation strategy; advantages and disadvantages.

HEI 722: Business ethics and legal considerations in entrepreneurship (two-credit units). The course contents consist of an Introduction to Business Ethics; Ethical Principles in Business; Moral Development and Reasoning; Ethical Theory; Ethics, Justice and Business, Ethics of Advertisement and sales; The Business Systems; Ethics and Environmentalism; The Ethics of Job Discrimination; Individuals in the Organisation; Corporations and Corporate Governance; Board of Directors; Investment Banking and Security Analysis; Creditors and Credit Procedures; Activities of Shareholders; Corporate Takeovers: Mergers and Acquisitions and Corporate Social Responsibilities.

GES 111 and GES 121 are communications in English language and literature. It is a two-credit unit compulsory foundational course taught at both first and second semester to all freshly admitted students into the various programmes of the university. It is designed for the development of grammatical sentences, writing techniques and other require parts needed for report writing and presentation.
