CONTRIBUTION TO KNOWLEDGE

My foremost contribution to knowledge is in reducing the scourge of infectious diseases, occupational diseases, thereby reducing medical morbidity and mortality, especially as they affect respiratory health. Research on infectious disease surveillance practice among doctors demonstrated best practice amongst specialists, and worst practice among the junior cadres of doctors (Residents and House Officers). This led to promoting the need to incorporate surveillance practice into curriculum of medical students (2nd dissertation). This research work fetched me the best of International Trainee Award of American Thoracic Society when presented at International conference in May 2009.

Illness behavior is a major cause of late presentation in the hospital with resultant poor prognostic outcome. People's health belief influence their health behavior including the decision about when and whom to consult for health advice (1st monograph, 25th journal article).

Over two thirds of the burden of HIV related tuberculosis is in sub Saharan Africa, the impact is catastrophic in Nigeria being the fourth most burdened country in the world (2nd monograph). There is urgent need to double our effort in reducing the scourge of the twin disease in areas of advocacy, health education, and policy formulations as well as improving surveillance practice. In our own local environment (Sagamu) HIV is a major cause of mortality in our wards (1st journal article).

In my contribution to reduce the scourge of infectious diseases, I collaborated with my national and International colleagues to determine impact of viral as well as resistant strains of staphylococcus and Tuberculosis infection (15,16, 17, 22, 23, 24,26,27,28, 32 and 35).

WHO defined health as a state of complete physical, mental and social well-being and not merely the absence of disease or infirmity, postpartum mental illness is noted to occur mostly in women with marital disharmony as well as family history of psychiatric disease. The incidence is however is low in our practice, 2.9 per 1000 births 2nd article.

Various occupational exposures were found to have impact on respiratory functions and in some instance predisposed to developing tuberculosis (silico tuberculosis in cement workers published conference proceedings 1 and 2). Biomass fuel exposures in our environment affects not only the function but quality of life as well as intellect of patients (paper presented at European Respiratory Society conference London, Sept, 2016),18th and 20th journal.

Of all causes of non-communicable disease, cancers remain the most common cause of death. In our environment, in view of improved standard of living, increasing incidence and prevalence of cancers have contributed to escalating morbidity/ mortality in the last 5 decades.

Dynamics of most cancers have been understudied and elucidated and has therefore been concluded while it may be very difficult to prevent death in established cancer disease, studies have shown that when they are picked at the very early stages, very many of the cancer diseases can be cured or premature can be prevented with better quality of life.

At late stages, most metastases ultimately affect the respiratory organs leading to death. This is the global essence of screening for cancer diseases and this is why the current global essence is geared towards prevention and early detection. Health screening assists in early detection of cancers (9,10,11), cardiovascular diseases (3), respiratory diseases (7, 12, 18,19, 20, 21, 22,24,26,27) and even fungal infections especially amongst school children (5) Mental health screening amongst medical student reveals; academic stress, financial constraint and lack of confidence as major causes of depression in them (8).
